1.

UNITED METHODIST ACTIVITIES:

- Attended church services at United Methodist church in Cap Haitien.
- Recruited volunteer to replace me while I recuperated from leg surgery.
- Recruited and hosted three work teams.(Linda Poindexter hosted two of them)
- Spoke at several United Methodist Churches during summer.
- Assisted United Methodist Committee that plan to start an orphanage.
- Taught educational activities to orphaned children every Saturday morning.
- Provided free clinic consultations for orphaned children.
- Provided transportation to United Methodist orphanage committee.
- Sent funding letters to Mission Committee Chairpersons on mailing list.

EVANGELISM:

- Held weekly Christian Leadership Development Classes for college age youth.
- Provided devotions to orphaned children weekly.
- Conducted devotions to patients at clinic each morning before clinic opened.
- Provided devotions for English classes.

SCHOOL SPONSORSHIP PROGRAM:

- Paid fees for elementary students to attend various schools.
- Paid fees for secondary students to attend various schools.
- Bought cloth and contracted to have uniforms made for students.
- Purchased and distributed books to students.
- Distributed school supplies and hygiene supplies to students each semester.
- Provided shoes and clothing to each student.
- Coordinated Helen Robertson's School Sponsorships
- Provided backpacks to children needing them.
- Took photos of all students and sent them to sponsors.
- Sent funding letters to all school sponsors.

4. **CHILD IN CRISIS PROGRAM:**

- Solicited clothing and other emergency supplies for children.
- Solicited toys and distributed them to orphans and children who were patients at clinic.
- Coordinated the distribution of shoes donated by the Heart and Sole Program at Michigan State

University.

- Distributed blankets to orphans and children at clinic.
- Collected money to assist earthquake damaged orphanage in Port-au-Prince.
- Provided funding and built bathroom for government school.

5.

HEALTH SERVICES:

- Provided medical treatment 4 days per week at our clinic.
- Provided worm pills to hundreds of school children.
- Started medical voucher program for orphaned children at clinic.
- Held weekly Community Health Worker classes for 21 students which were taught by our clinic nurse.
- Distributed rice at clinic for malnourished women and children.
- Recruited medical volunteers to work at clinic.
- Recruited volunteers to install floor tile and solar system at clinic.
- Recruited volunteers to drill well near clinic.
- Provided transportation for persons needing hospital care.
- Provided transportation for all clinic staff.
- Solicited supplies and equipment for medical clinic.
- Solicited and shipped supplies for local government hospital.
- Hosted Dr. Nasirri, the Assistant Dean of Osteopathic Medicine at Michigan State University when he visited Cap Haitien.
- Arranged meetings for Dr. Nasirri with the Mayor of Cap Haitien, Regional Health Department Director and two local Hospital Administrators.
- MSU and Sparrow Hospital have indicated interest in coming to help hospitals in Cap Haitien.

6. GARDEN/WELL PROGRAM:

- Hired two full time garden teachers.
- Held garden classes for about 100 students.
- Solicited free seeds for garden participants.
- Facilitated having wells repaired in Limonade area.
- Repaired several pumps.
- Facilitated having new community well drilled near clinic.
- Loaned truck to well drilling work team.
- Housed well drilling work team.
- Housed new well drilling coordinator for one month at Mission headquarters.
- Assisted new well drilling coordinators for one month prior to their moving to Haiti.
- Made benches for gardening classes,
- Held two Garden Festivals on May - which is Agriculture day in Haiti.

7. ENGLISH LANGUAGE LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT CLASSES:

- Taught weekly Advanced English Language classes at mission headquarters.
- Held weekly Christian Leadership classes at Mission Headquarters.
- Taught course on English words needed for Medical Translators.
- Taught weekly Intermediate English Language classes at mission headquarters.
- Paid teacher for beginning English classes at clinic.
- Administered English Language Achievement Tests to several students.
- Assisted student to write proposal for teaching Leadership Development which was funded.

8. ADMINISTRATION:

- Supervised 18 staff persons.
- Supervised Haitian construction crew.
- Coordinated work-team construction crews.(Linda Poindexter)
- Met Daily with Program staff.
- Organized new Soaring Association in Haiti for clinic.
- Wrote bylaws for new association.
- Met monthly with Soaring Association.
- Prepared and submitted paperwork necessary to obtain
- Prepared paperwork and obtained Permi de Sejour.
- Set up clinic records on computer.
- Wrote Soaring Unlimited Newsletter.
- Sent thank you notes for in kind donations sent to Haiti.
- Solicited program supplies and equipment.
- Arranged for Budget truck to be driven to Florida with donated supplies. (Bill DeLine and Jack Ammon.
- Packed about 4 ton of donated supplies to be shipped to Haiti. (Laurie Ammon coordinated packing)
- Arranged twice weekly pick-up of mail in Haiti at airport.
